- 1. Exhibitors are responsible for reading and following all rules.
- 2. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
- 3. Individual articles may not be shown for premium awards in more than one lot.
- 4. All entries must be labeled by class and lot numbers according to the descriptions in this Premium Book.

GENERAL FAIR RULES

- 5. Judges and /or superintendents reserve the right to reject any entry. "Exhibit Only" items will be gladly accepted as space allows.
- 6. Fair superintendents reserve the right to combine or create classes when and where desirable.
- 7. Judges determine first, second or if no premium will be awarded. Decision of judges is FINAL.
- 8. Exhibits must be removed from the Exhibit Hall or the Fairgrounds by 4:30 pm on the last day of the Fair.
- 9. Premiums will be paid on only one entry per lot in all divisions.
- 10. After payment of expenses, all remaining budgeted funds of the Fair will be used to pay premiums. The value of each premium point will be determined by dividing the total number of points awarded into the total amount of money left for payment of premium point awards. Each 1st place ribbon will receive 4 points; each 2nd place receives 2 points. Premiums will be paid by check.
- 11. Exhibitors are responsible for providing a mailing address in order to receive premium checks. Undeliverable checks will be donated back to the fair.
- 12. Management holds no responsibility for exhibits.
- 13. The Baker Co Fair-Halfway, or Management, will not be responsible for any accident happening on the Fairgrounds or any other place during the days of the Fair.

BE FOREWARNED: READ THE RULES AND REGULATIONS!

No violations will be permitted! Do not be disappointed by rejections of any entry because of late arrival.

LIVESTOCK RULES & REGULATIONS

1) All animals (market and breeding) must be entered by July 1 st via On-line at www.halfwayfairandrodeo.com Directions for online entries and required forms for market animals are on the website. Direct questions or assistance to bcfprlivestock@gmail.com.

- 2) Market animals may by shown by living full time in Baker County or the immediate North Powder area. Each exhibitor may enter one animal per lot, except small animals. See that Division.
- 3) Market animals must be tagged with your tag and tag numbers must be entered on the entry form in the appropriate space. We use the honor system when tagging because we believe in the integrity of the families in Baker County. Scrapie tags are mandatory in sheep and goats. You may use the last four digits on your scrapie tag as your number.

4) At the time of weigh in, steer owners must provide the following: (1) ownership E-slip, (2) transportation slip,

(3) prohibited feed affidavit. Steers without complete paperwork will not be weighed and must leave the grounds.

5) All leased animals must have a signed lease by July 1, 2021. It must be turned in at weigh in.

6) Weight limits are:

Steers 1,050 lbs. Min. born after January 1 previous year 1400 lbs. Maximum saleable weight

Lambs 110 lbs. Min. 160 lbs. Maximum saleable weight

Hogs 220 lbs. Min. 290 lbs. Maximum saleable weight

Goats 70 lbs. Min. 120 lbs. Maximum saleable weight

Rabbits 4-6 lbs. each, sold in pens of three

Roaster Chickens (pen of three, 6.5 lbs. – 8.5 lbs., over 3 mos. – under 6 mos.)

Turkey, pen of one, Hens, (under 16 weeks), 12 - 16 lbs.; Toms, (under 25 weeks) 20 to 30 lbs.

Goose, pen of one, (under 20 weeks), 8-15 lbs.

Duck, pen of three, (under 10 weeks), 5 – 8 lbs each.

7) All animails will weigh in between 5 pm and 8 pm on Friday. Registration will be Friday from 5 pm to 8 pm. Animals not registered by 8 pm will not show. You are welcome to bring animals earlier Friday afternoon but weigh in will not start

before 5 pm.

- 8) All livestock entered for exhibition must be gentle and broke to lead. Please do not bring any animal that may be a risk for hurting someone. Judges and superintendents have the right to send wild animals home.
- 9) Superintendents have the right to send home any livestock that exhibits signs of disease or sickness, sheep showing signs of prolapse, etc. All disputes will be settled by calling in a veterinarian at owner's expense.
- 10) Animals must be bedded down in a clean pen and fed and watered appropriately at all times.
- 11) All animals must be clean and clipped. Sheep must be slick shorn. Slick shorn means being shorn no more than four days before showing.
- 12) Premium points are paid on all breeding classes. Number of entries are limited to one entry per exhibitor per lot. No premium paid for market animals.
- 13) Place points are not paid premium points, but count toward High Point awards, Grand and Reserve Grand Champion, and Champion and Reserve Champion placings do not count toward High Point awards. Point system for High Point awards is: 1st-6 pts, 2nd-5pts, 3rd-4pts, 4th-3pts, 5th-2pts, 6th-1pt.
- 14) Classes and lots will be determined and /or combined by Superintendents only.
- 15) Showmanship animals must be owned by the exhibitor. Younger exhibitors may show an animal owned by an immediate family member. You must show in showmanship to sell your animal.
- 16) A 4 percent commission will be deducted from your check. Steers will be charged a \$50 shipping fee. Checks will be mailed out as soon as the money is collected! Usually not before Thanksgiving.
- 17) Stall/pen and tack area must be cleaned and exhibitor must be checked out by species superintendents before you can leave Monday. If pens are not clean a \$25 fine will be withheld from your check. Breeding exhibitors will be billed.
- 18) CAMPING: Family camping near the pavilion will be available on a first-come first-serve basis. Please be respectful of the need for younger exhibitors to sleep and turn your noise and generators off by 9 pm. Camping fee is \$5 per night, \$15 for the weekend. Payable when you register (don't send checks this year.) A family unit is immediate family only.

Campers are responsible for picking up all garbage from the field, throughout the pavilion, and beyond, all four days. Also, please help keep the bathrooms clean. Please keep your dogs in camp, not in the pavilion. Leave extra horses home..of course, you may bring your horse if you are entered in the rodeo. Pavilion will be locked from 10 pm until 6 am with security in the building.

19) Each market exhibitor must submit a photograph of their animal with their entry form. If submitting photo electronically, entry form must be simultaneously submitted as a pdf. Entries sent by text message or photos of entry forms will be rejected.

FLORICULTURE, FLOWERS – Division L Superintendent- Lynne Smith - 541-540-6481 RULES FOR ALL CLASSES

- 1. The class or kind of flower must be on the exhibit tag (written in pencil attached to the exhibit.)
- 2. The number of stems required are shown in parentheses () after each type as listed below.
- 3. Exhibitors will bring their clear glass jar to exhibit entry. Clear glass is desirable.
- 4. Flowers must be grown and selected by the exhibitor.
- 5. Exhibitors will enter in one of the four age groups (S, A, T, J) listed in the General Rules.
- 6. Cut your flowers in late afternoon or evening the day before they are exhibited. Place them in lukewarm water, keeping them in a dark place overnight. It is highly recommended and would be to the exhibitor's advantage to use a floral preservative powder in your water at the time of picking and arranging. There are several brands available and you can obtain them from a seed company (i.e. Springhill, etc. or online.) By using a preservative you can easily cut your flowers 2 days ahead , particularly beneficial to those who have many entries to cut.
- 7. Select material in its prime, pest free, cutting stems as long as possible but proportion to the flower.
- 8. Flowers must carry own attached, healthy foliage.
- 9. Name variety of flower when possible.
- 10. Roses Try to name your rose. Select rose with healthy stem and foliage. Blooms should be 1/2 to 2/3 open. Hybrid tea roses should be grown disbudded.
- 11. Gladiolas- Should have 1/3 open, 1/3 part open and 1/3 closed florets on long, straight stiff stem with 1 leaf. Remove side shoots.
- 12. Dahlias- Each stem should have 2 leaves, no buds, and centers showing only in single or collarette varieties. For large decorative (dinner plate) varieties, no foliage required. Be sure to de-bud close to the selected bloom to assure foliage (except on dinner plate variety.)
- 13. Judging will be done on a competitive basis, determining first and second places. When in the opinion of the judge an exhibit does not merit an award, none will be given. The decision of the judge will be final.

General Rules:

- 1. All entries must have been prepared by the exhibitor during the past 12 months. Only one entry per lot number unless otherwise specified.
- 2. All canned goods shall be processed in standard quart, pint, or half-pint jars. Standard means Kerr, Ball or Mason (no mayonnaise jars etc.) Dried foods can be exhibited in half-pint jars. Each jar filled to capacity with dehydrated foods. Lids and bands must be CLEAN, plastic or metal. Fruit leathers must be wrapped in clear plastic, 6 inch round.
- 3. Sample Label: All food preservation exhibits should have a label with the following information attached to the bottom front of the jar (see example below)
- 4. Make sure all jars are clean and bands can be easily removed by the Judge. (No sticky dirty jars will be judged) No paraffin on jams or jellies. The judge has the privilege of opening any entry.
- Exhibits will be judged by A. Container B. Labeled Properly C. Packed properly D. Neatness E. Uniformity (liquid to just cover product clear) F. Absence of defects in food, *uniform pieces * G. Color consistency without over or under cooking.
